

It is particularly concerned to protect important Manx nineteenth and early twentieth century buildings, both public and private, industrial monuments

The Isle of Man Victorian Society generally meets on a monthly basis during the winter months at St Andrew's Church, Glencrutchery Road, Douglas (near to St. Ninian's High School), and in the summer it organises visits to buildings or areas of Victorian and Edwardian interest.
